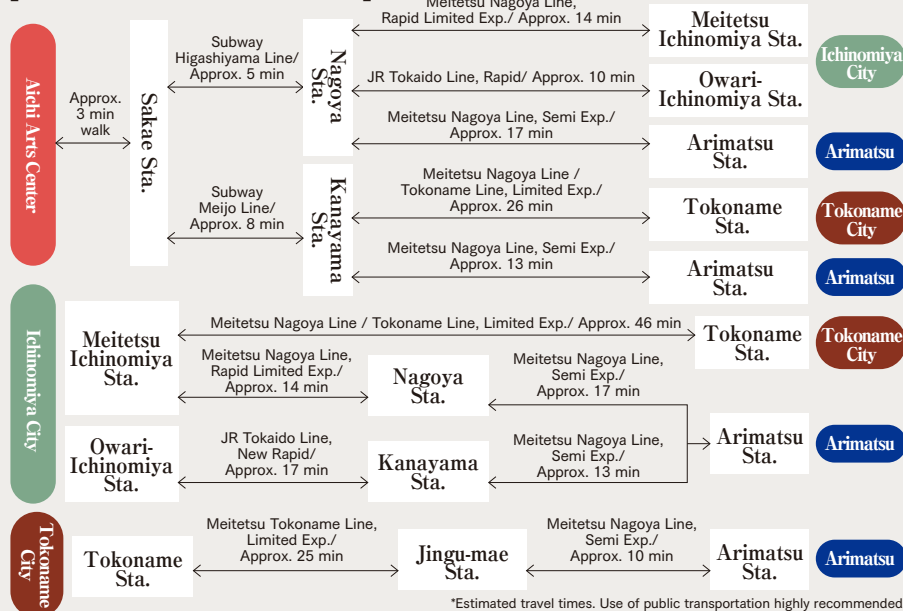

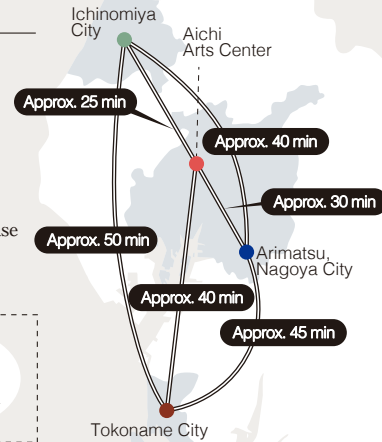

It is a great pleasure for me to welcome you to Aichi Triennale 2022 “STILL ALIVE.” We are living in uncertain times of ongoing wars, pandemic diseases and natural disasters. I would like Aichi Triennale 2022 to become an opportunity for us to come together and think about fundamental questions: How can we survive in times like today? What are the possibilities of art? What does it mean to be alive? The title of this year’s triennale, “STILL ALIVE,” is inspired by a long-term artwork by Aichi-born artist On Kawara (1932–2014). For more than 30 years since the 1970s, Kawara sent out more than 900 letters and telegrams stating “I AM STILL ALIVE” to friends and acquaintances all over the world.

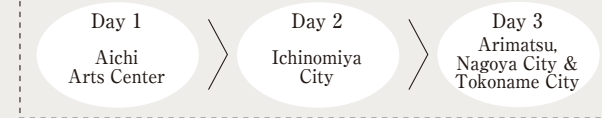
Aichi Triennale 2022 features 100 artists from 32 countries and regions whose work responds in some way to the theme “STILL ALIVE.” For the Contemporary Art Exhibition, we have chosen artworks that enter into a dialogue with the specific local culture or history of the four host cities. We hope you will enjoy the exhibitions as well as the many events held as part of the Performing Arts and Learning Programs during the 73 Triennale days, and leave with more hope and energy for the future.

Enjoy Ichinomiya all the way to Bisai Ichinomiya City — pages 8-11

Ichinomiya City features a number of different exhibitions. The exhibition sites near Ichinomiya station focus on themes of life, death, sickness, prayer, mental health and well-being. The exhibitions in the Bisai area delve into Ichinomiya's history as a textile capital and are housed in interesting venues such as a factory with a saw-tooth roof and Sumi Memorial Hall, the only building in Aichi designed by Tange Kenzo.

Walk along the Pottery Footpath Tokoname City — pages 12-15

Tokoname City is home to one of the oldest kilns in Japan, dating back to the late Heian period in the 12th century. The venues are located on and around the famous Pottery Footpath with its Showa-era charm and reach all the way to the INAX Museums. The works on display explore the relationships between human culture and the natural elements.

Recommended Route

Contemporary Art Exhibition touches upon the origins of conceptual art and examines performing arts in the context of contemporary art. The exhibition offers a multi-dimensional interpretation of Aichi 2022's theme "STILL ALIVE" through artworks in various media and from a multitude of perspectives, including works by significant figures from the world of conceptual art, works that reconsider modern representation, works related to migration and displacement, and works that explore the power of the natural and supernatural. Start your visit at AC01 on B2 and head to 10F. Proceed to the exhibits on 8F and finish your tour back on B2 at AC49.

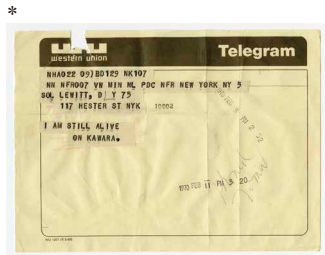

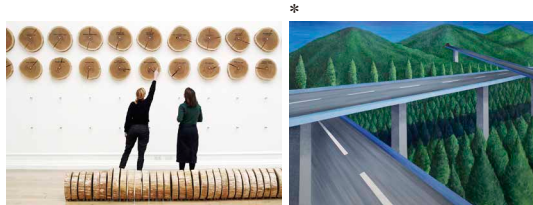

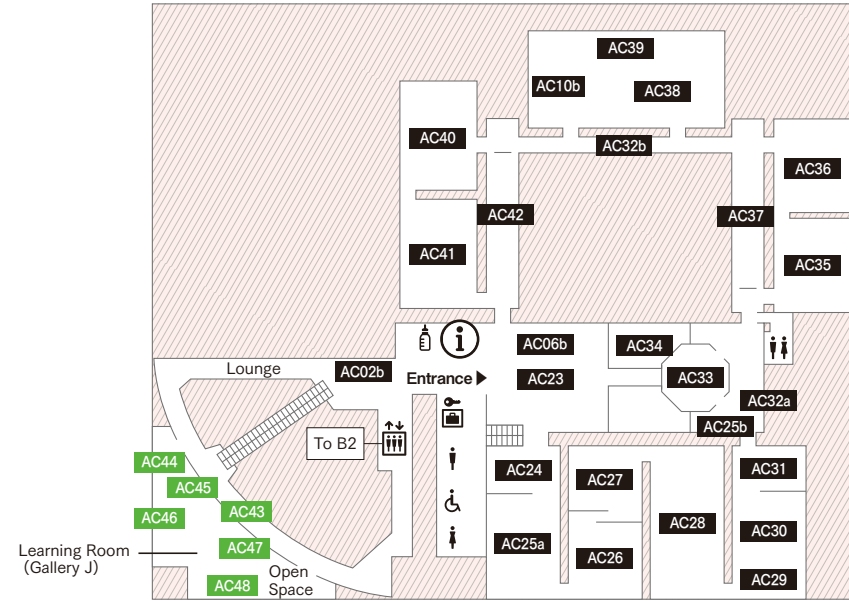

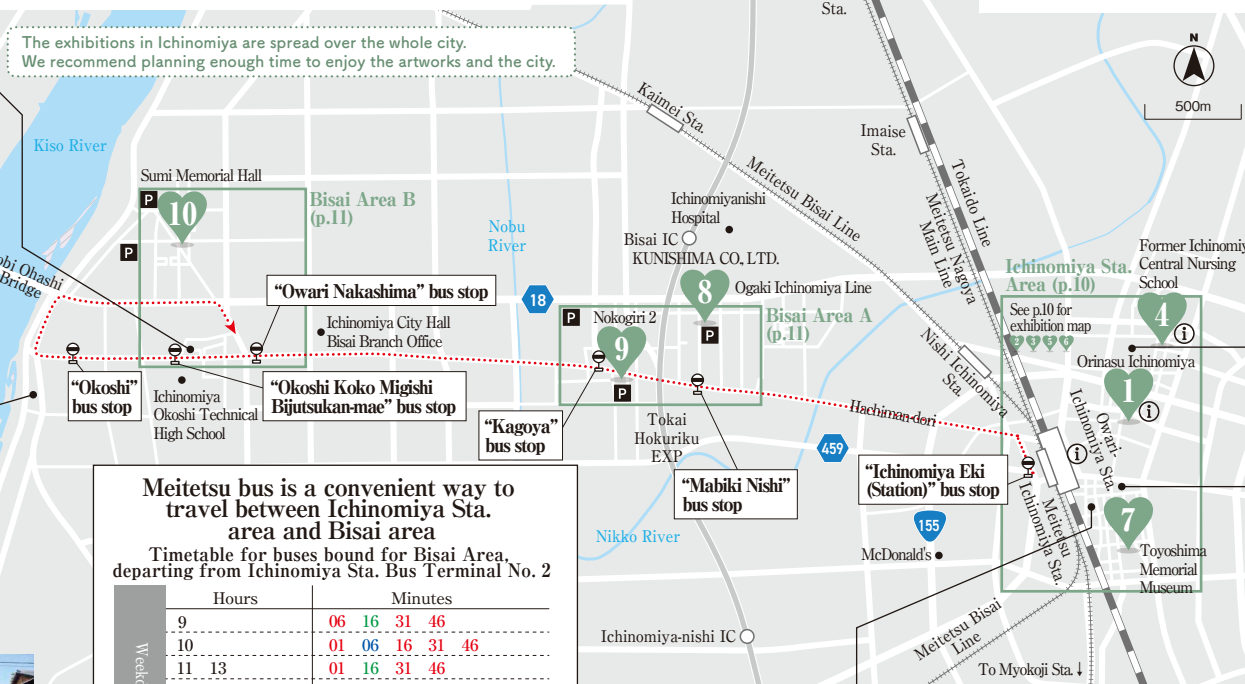

The exhibitions between Ichinomiya station and Masumida Shrine feature artworks themed on life, death, care, prayer and mental health. Visit 1 for an uplifting exhibition by Yoshitomo Nara. Circle 2, 3, go through the Honmachi Shopping Arcade leading up to Masumida Shrine and head towards 4 and 5 for the sites with the most artworks in Ichinomiya. Then walk south through the Shopping Arcade to head towards the Bisai area 7. In Bisai, take the bus from 8 to 9 (p.8-9) to find artworks that explore the history of the local textile industry.

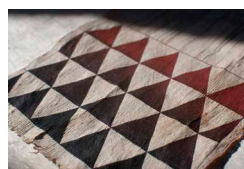

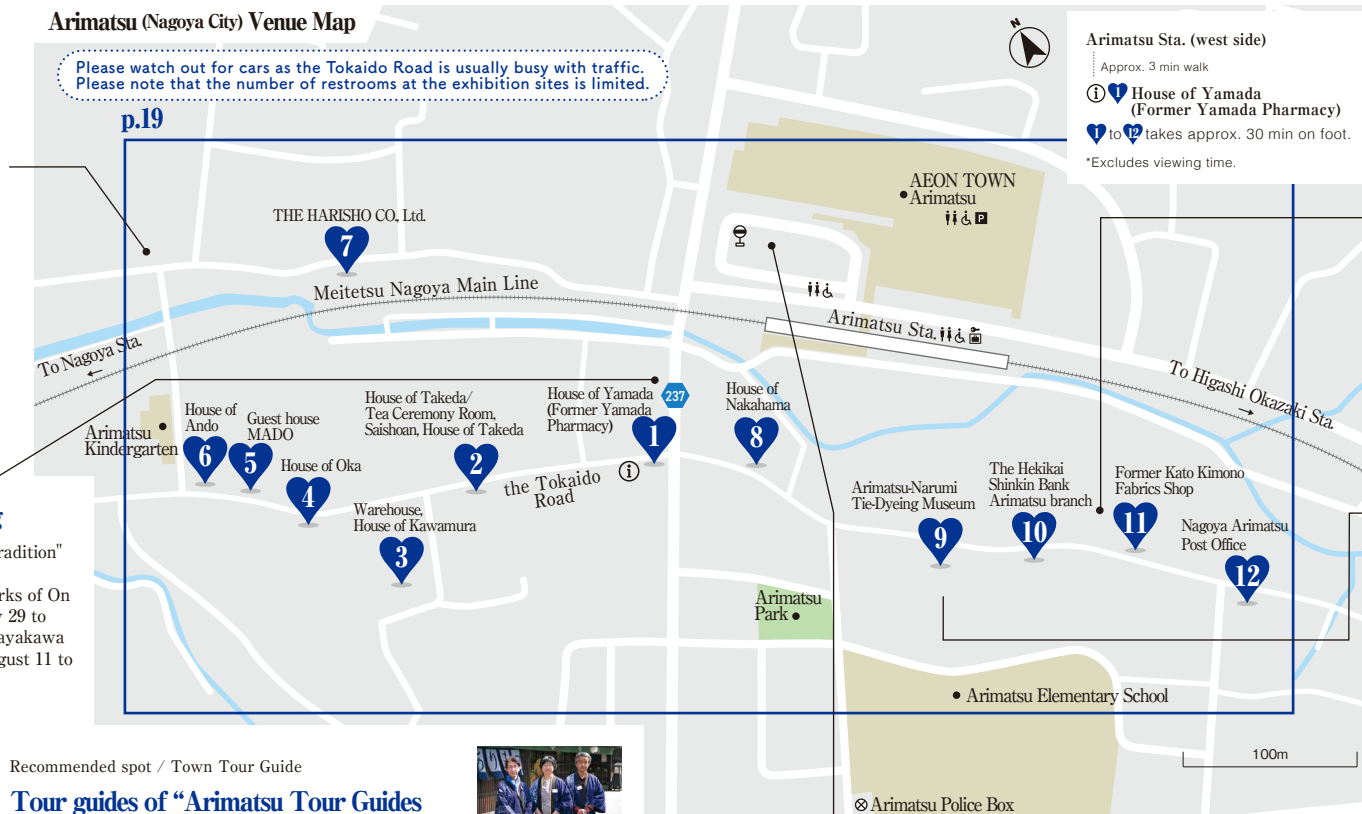

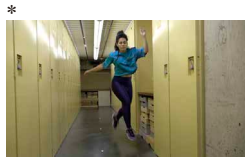

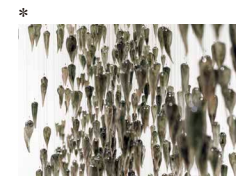

Walking through the installation invites you to imagine memories and hardships that the land and her ancestors experienced as Indigenous people in Australia.

Learning Room

The Learning Room on 8F of the Aichi Arts Center forms the base of the Learning Programs. Featured exhibits include artworks created through collaborative research about “Aichi and the world,” and the event program “Art Tekiya 2022” with workshops and talks.

Guided Tours
