Welcome to the Aichi Triennale 2025

More than 60 artists and groups will gather here in Aichi under the theme "A Time Between Ashes and Roses." They will present artworks, installations and performances highlighting the variety of locations in both Nagoya, a large art centre in the middle of the city, and Seto City, an art museum designed by renowned architect Taniguchi Yoshiro surrounded by lush green hillsides to a nostalgic arcade shopping street lined with old and new shops. Aichi Triennale 2025 takes inspiration from all these locations, the long history of pottery and ceramics industry in the region, the urban nightlife with parties and club events, as well as working with and showcasing works by manga artists. We are also working with restaurants to offer food cooked with local ingredients or based on recipes shared by the participating artists etc.

We hope that this festival will really open our eyes to our presence in this world. As we are currently witnessing genocides, we have to stop and think about our roles as curators, artists, cultural practitioners, teachers... how can we create a festival that is both celebratory but also eye opening? Aichi Triennale 2025 aims to bring to the forefront many issues surrounding us so we can come together to amplify our voices and fight for a more peaceful and hopeful future.





FAQs to help you enjoy the Aichi Triennale 2025 even more

Q.1 How many days should I take to visit the venues?

A. Ideally, we would recommend visiting one venue per day, for a total of three days. This should allow you to enjoy the Performing Arts and Learning programs, and to take in the cities and towns hosting the festival. For visitors on a tight schedule, we have prepared several sample itineraries (→P12, P24).

Q.2 What kinds of art engagement tours are available?

A. We offer interactive art engagement tours that will allow you to deepen your engagement with the artworks by discussing in a group what you felt and thought about them. There are also tours featuring explanations of the artworks, making it easier to enjoy them. We also offer tours for visitors with visual and hearing impairments, and for visitors with small children.

Q.3 Can I view the venue map on my smartphone?

A. There is an official digital map that provides useful information for experiencing the city, as well as the exhibition venues. It features a guide function that directs you to the spots you want to visit, so we recommend using this guide together with the map to enjoy the Aichi Triennale 2025.

Q.4 Where can I buy merchandise?

A. There are official shops at each venue selling goods related to the festival and featured artists, including a variety of goods with the festival's key visuals created by a manga artist, Igarashi Daisuke. In addition, TEMPORA (a shop made in collaboration with local businesses), will open at the Aichi Arts Center (→P7), and visitors to Seto City's Seto Suehiro-cho Shopping Street (→P22) will be able to visit LIVERARY Extra Season 5.

Q.5 Tips for visitors.

A. Opening times vary for each venue, so be sure to check the Calendar / Opening hours information (→P28) before making a visit. Seto City has hills and roads with heavy traffic, so wear comfortable clothing and be attentive. Don't forget to stay hydrated on hot days. Taking photos and videos is permitted except for works with "no photography" signs. Feel free to share your images on social media!

Aichi Arts Center

10:00-18:00 (20:00 on Fridays) *Last admission 30 minutes before closing time. Closed on Mondays (If Monday is a public holiday, the following Tuesday will be closed) *Open on Tuesdays September 16 and November 25.

This complex includes the Aichi Prefectural Museum of Art, which will hold contemporary art exhibitions across multiple floors, and the Aichi Prefectural Art Theater, which will host a variety of performing arts productions. The center will also be the location of official and collaboration shops, as well as a learning center. It is surrounded by a bustling shopping district with a range of accommodations and restaurants, and will serve as a base camp for art appreciation.


Accessible services and options for all visitors

The museum spaces include the recently reopened Main Gallery, the "Design Aichi" Gallery, the Ceramic Craft Studio (a pottery experience facility), and the Old Kiln Sites House with the remains of ancient kilns. The museum dedicates itself to the art and tradition of pottery and takes a multi-faceted approach to convey its fascination and beauty to its visitors. Its outdoor spaces also make it an inviting place to visit and linger.

Aichi Triennale 2025 Staff Recommendations

1 Take a full day to enjoy the whole museum

You can enjoy not only the "Aichi 2025" artworks in four buildings and a plaza, but also the exhibition on the second floor of the Main Gallery. Another hilight is the building, designed by renouned archtect Taniquchi Yoshiro and recently renovated.





Seto City is one of the largest pottery production centers in Japan and the origin for the word "setomono" as a term for Japanese clay and earthenware. The exhibitions will be held in a variety of locations unique to the area, such as a former elementary school, an old public bathhouse, a clay factory, and shopping street that reminds Hoor Al Qasimi, the festival's artistic director, of her home town.

Aichi Triennale 2025 Staff Recommendations

Lexplore local artworks in shops and stores around town

Take a stroll through Seto and enjoy the unique atmosphere of this traditional Japanese pottery town with its kiln walls built of stacked old kiln tools and shopping streets dotted with renovated cafes and boutiques. During your walk, check out the many pieces of pottery displayed in gardens and storefronts - a testament to the town's deeply rooted pottery culture.

Choose north or south – or stay and enjoy the whole city

Seto and the surrounding cityscape offer plenty to spend the whole day exploring. But if you're pressed for time, we recommend focusing on either the north or the south side. Each has its own unique charm - in the south, you will find an old public bathhouse and art museums, while the north features a former elementary school and a factory.

Things to know while walking around

We recommend exploring the city on foot, as you'll be able to access the many narrow streets in the central area more easily. Please keep noise to a minimum in residential areas, and be mindful not to enter private property. On hot days, you can stay hydrated at convenience stores such as the one in front of the station, local cafes, and vending machines in the city center. Coin lockers for baggage are available at locations such as Parti Seto and SETO-GURA.
